# Educating tomorrow's voters, neighbors, community leaders, and land use professionals

*UrbanPlan* is a realistic, engaging and academically challenging classroom-based curriculum in which high school seniors learn the roles, issues, economics and tradeoffs involved in urban development. Students learn how market forces (e.g. supply and demand) interact with non-market forces (e.g. regulations, politics, interest groups) in real life.

#### How does *UrbanPlan* work in the classroom?

Over the course of three weeks, students form company teams to respond to a "Request for Proposals" for the redevelopment of a specific urban area with the goal of winning the contract. Each team member assumes one of five roles: finance director, marketing director, city liaison, neighborhood liaison, and site planner. Through these roles, students develop a real-life understanding of the various stakeholders in the development process and the challenge of reconciling competing agendas to create a well-designed, sustainable project.

Teams address challenging financial, social, political, and design issues, develop a business proposal and a threedimensional model of their plan, and present their proposal to a "City Council" of ULI members that awards the contract to the winning team.

# The ULI Minnesota UrbanPlan experience

*UrbanPlan* Minnesota began in Roseville High School in 2006 with teacher Steve Bekemeyer, it was expanded into Benilde-St. Margaret's High School, under the guidance of teacher Amy Weisgram in the Spring of 2009.

#### Volunteers are essential!

Local land use professionals, who have attended *UrbanPlan* volunteer training, interact several times with the student teams—as facilitators, presenters, and jurors. The program's success is dependent on our volunteers!



*UrbanPl*an volunteer time commitment:

- 5 hour training session
- 2 hour preparation for the training session
- "Facilitators" and "presenters" volunteer a minimum of two class periods (50 minutes)
- "City council members" (jurors) volunteer approximately half a day
- Consider making a meaningful contribution for as little as one-half day, one or two times a year.
